

Curriculum

Stages of the Primary Curriculum:

Foundation Stage: P1-2 Key Stage 1: P3-4 Key Stage 2: P5-7

Structure of the Primary Curriculum:

Our staff teach a curriculum that is broad, balanced and flexible. Tailored to meet the needs of individual children that stimulates, inspires and develops all types of learners.

There are six Areas of Learning for each of the Key Stages.

- Language and Literacy (including Talking and Listening, Reading and Writing);
- 2. Mathematics and Numeracy (focusing on the development of mathematical concepts across the curriculum, Number, Measure, Shape and Space and Handling Data);
- 3. The Arts (including Art and Design, Drama and Music);
- 4. The World Around Us (focusing on the development of knowledge, skills and understanding in Science and Technology, History and Geography);
- 5. Personal Development and Mutual Understanding (focusing on emotional development, social skills, learning to learn, health, relationships and mutual understanding in the local and global community);
- 6. Physical Education (focusing on the development of knowledge, skills and understanding through play and a range of physical activities).



Olderfleet is committed to provide children with the space, the attitude and the opportunities to learn in a natural environment.

We implement learning opportunities that, together with the learning taking place inside the classroom, will allow children to have an opportunity to transfer their skills, both outdoors and indoors

The outdoor environment offers space and therefore is particularly important to those children who learn best through active movement. Very young children learn predominately through their sensory and physical experiences which supports brain development and the creation of neural networks.

Forest Schools

Olderfleet is a Forest School which enables us to deliver sessions through nurture learner-led exploration and discovery, nurturing meaningful experiences for positive lifelong impacts.

Forest schools is an inspirational process, which offers all learners regular opportunities to achieve and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in a woodland or natural environment with trees.

Religious Education

Religious Education is taught in accordance with the Education Reform Order 1989. We teach our pupils from a prescribed core syllabus.

Pupils, unless withdrawn with parental consent, participate in assemblies. At our assemblies, we have regular visitors from within and beyond our community.

We invite parents and family to come along to our Christmas services.





Learning at Home

Using our digital platforms, children have immediate access to resources. We value our pupils' independent learning and consider it vital in our home-school link. Parents can share in their child's learning experiences and support the school as our educational partners.

Homework varies within the Key Stages and may consist of written activities, reading, practical work or even a research task, depending on the age and ability of the child. We also deliver high quality digital programmes which develop new world digital skills and curriculum objectives.

Reporting Assessment & Record Keeping

Ongoing pupil assessments, both formal and informal, forms a vital part of teachers meeting the needs of all our pupils.

We value pupil voice and encourage their involvement in their own learning and attainment through use of Assessment for Learning throughout the school.

Pupils participate in active target setting and self-evaluation to support their own learning goals.

Pupils participate in end of Key Stage assessments. Levels achieved in these Key Stage results are included in the Annual Report. From Year 3 all pupils participate in standardised tests towards the end of the academic year.

At Olderfleet, we offer an open-door policy and digital communication platform to the parents/ guardians of our pupils whereby they can feel free to discuss any issues they may have regarding their child's progress.

Parents' Association

Olderfleet benefits from having an active Parents' Association who assist in the organisation of events. These events are often of a nature which allow parents, friends and children of the school to enjoy each other's company in a range of activities. Many of the activities are designed with the raising of school funds. The help that is generated by the Parents' Association is greatly appreciated and all those attending the school benefit from this support.

Pupil Voice

Our school council is elected annually by their peers in a fun election campaign programme. At our council meetings, pupils consult with their classmates and staff on issues that matter to the school community.

Special Educational Needs

We aim to support all pupils to ensure that they can access a broad and balanced curriculum at every stage of their development.

We use professional teacher judgement and standardised scores to identify difficulties. Through early intervention approaches, we work closely with the pupil and parent in actively supporting the child's needs.

Where appropriate, our Learning Support Co-Ordinator will work with all available external agencies to support pupils with additional educational needs.

Olderfleet Primary School has an excellent reputation for supporting pupils who need additional help. Our teachers and classroom assistants use a wide range of strategies to help and support our children. We offer additional individual literacy or numeracy support programmes and cater for sensory support in our designated sensory space.

Gifted and Talented

'Gifted and talented' describes children with the ability or potential to develop significantly ahead of their peers:

- · 'Gifted' learners are those with abilities in one or more academic subjects, such as Maths or English
- 'Talented' learners are those who have practical skills in areas such as sport, music, design or creative and performing art

We have a responsibility to meet the educational needs of all our pupils, and teachers will set tasks that consider the varying abilities of all our children.



Educational Visits

We very much value the central role educational visits can play in a child's education. There are many benefits to visits both educationally and socially.

Each year group participates in at least one visit per year and all classes actively invite visitors into the school to speak to pupils, where appropriate.

Promoting Positive Behaviour

We operate a proactive approach to behaviour focusing on the positive. Our aim is to encourage pupils to develop resilience and confidence in an atmosphere of respect, tolerance and mutual understanding.

We have a child centred approach to all we do and an integral part of this is the close liaison between the parent, class teacher and Principal.

Child Protection

In Olderfleet, we have a responsibility for the care, welfare and safety of all of our pupils. It is essential that we are aware of any changes outside school which may affect your child in school. Something considered 'not very important' may in fact have a huge impact on how your child performs at school. We seek to protect our pupils by helping them to acquire the confidence and skills they need to keep themselves safe. Our Child Protection policy has clear guidance on procedures to follow when there are concerns about the welfare and protection of any child.

Anti-Bullying

Olderfleet is a Rights Respecting School and we take a proactive approach to bullying. Regular class activities, assemblies and whole school workshops take place to highlight the effects of bullying and methods used to reduce it. Any incidents of bullying are taken very seriously and are dealt in accordance with the procedures and actions outlined in our Anti Bullying Policy.

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Charges & Remissions Policy

We provide a free education for all pupils at Olderfleet Primary School under the Education Reform Order 1989. There are a few exceptions:

- All board, lodging and travel costs on residential trips (except where statutory remissions apply)
- Cost associated with optional extras, for example, visits to theatre or extra-curricular activities
- Materials or ingredients used in practical subjects where parents have indicated that they wish to receive the finished product.
- Tuition in a musical instrument
- Swimming Instruction

The school will, as it has done in the past, appeal to parents from time to time for voluntary donations but it is stressed that no child will be disadvantaged in any way if the parents choose not to make a contribution.

Admissions

Full admissions criteria are detailed on enrolment application forms and are available upon request from the school office.

The Board of Governors has established admissions criteria to be applied in the event of applications to the school exceeding the figures determined by the Department of Education. The enrolment and admissions number for Olderfleet Primary School are:

Stay Informed

We actively encourage parental involvement throughout all stages of your child's education. It is vital that there are good lines of communication throughout their primary school journey.

We promote this from a very early stage and an invitation is extended to parents of Year I children to attend induction sessions, Parent information afternoons, weekly newsletters, parent teacher meetings and curriculum information sessions.

As your child progresses throughout Olderfleet PS, parents/ guardians are invited to two parent teacher meetings and an annual report is created in June providing information on progress and attainment.
